2022 Passage of Bond Ordinance #299

The lowest interest proposal received was .75% from Washington Savings Bank. The money will be received after closing with the bank February 1st. The \$625,000.00 plus interest will be paid back by December 1, 2022. About \$475,000.00 of the money will be used to cover debt certificates related to the Workman Sports Complex. This will be year seven of a 15 year pay off schedule. The original loan was \$6 million. The remainder, about \$150,000.00, will be used for fencing, pavilions, outdoor restrooms, and other park facility improvements and costs.
