# Secretary's Report

# Treasurer's Report

Treasurer, Anita Broom, reviewed fund income statements for the month of September, 2023. Corporate fund revenue was \$46,070.14 of which \$46,000.00 was a contribution from the South Eastern Community Foundation for the skate park. Total expenses were \$88,985.54 which included \$50,000.00 transferred last month to the Workman Sports Complex. Net income was a negative \$42,915.40. Recreation fund revenue was \$1,855.91. Expenses were \$34,073.13 leaving a net income of a negative \$32,217.2. Pool revenue year to date is a negative \$53,939.26 due in part for the need to purchase expensive pool chemicals this year.

# **Director's Report**

#### Restrooms

Althoff said the remodel of the restrooms at the Ron Diehl Center will begin the first week of January starting with the men's followed by the women's, then the handicapped. Toilets will be replaced, men's showers will be blocked off with a door, painting will be done.

### **Basement Renovation**

The basement area at the Ron Diehl Center will be renovated in the spring to correct water damage to the area. Walls will be water proofed. Two sump pumps will be installed. Cost of the work will be about \$14,000.00. If no more water damage occurs turf will be installed on the floor.

### Pickleball

Althoff said a lot of requests have been received to add pickleball courts to the gym at the Ron Diehl Center. That would entail strip coating the floor, painting lines on the floor, and sound proofing the door to the gym. Althoff will research the price for this work. He noted that gym time is almost always fully booked. Only a morning time might be available for pickleball.

Work is continuing to remove leaves and debris from the Trec Trail at no charge. Inventory is currently being taken to see what is needed for next spring.

### **Commissioners' Comments**

Cunningham said more outside light is needed at Hendelmeyer Park. He suggested installing cameras at the skate park and surrounding area.

Althoff noted that a teen age driver doing donuts in the parking lot at Hendelmeyer Park hit a corner of the shed. He was apprehended by the police.

It was suggested that signs indicating the parks' 11:00 o'clock closing time be prominently displayed at all of the parks. This would give police the authority to make people leave at that time.
